

# Thank you, Pet Peeves for helping to stem the feral cycle!



**Spaying our feral cat population helps stop the cycle of unwanted animals left to suffer on the streets.**

Thanks to the financial support of Pet Peeves, the Long Island Cat Project was able to purchase much needed Veterinary supplies, and through the use of the Suffolk SPCA Mobile Spay/Neuter Van, the Long Island Cat Project launched an unstoppable spay/neuter community service adventure for feral and stray cats on Long Island. Trappers targeted feral cats in problem areas where there were no benefactors for the cats. 35 cats were altered; 18 males were neutered, and 17 females spayed. All of the cats received vaccinations for Rabies and Distemper 3:1. All were treated for ear mites and fleas, then de-wormed and ear tipped, to identify them as having been cared for.

Dr. Gay Senk, who led the impressive effort said, "Our heartfelt thanks to you Pet Peeves for making this possible."

We thank you Dr. Senk, and your volunteers for providing care for Long Island's feral cats, while helping to break the reproductive cycle that leaves many of them homeless and unwanted.
