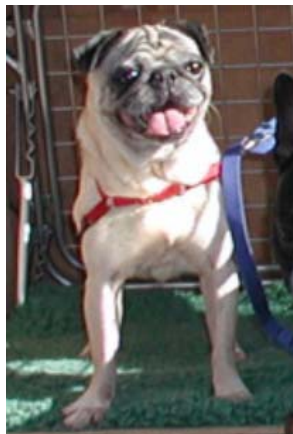

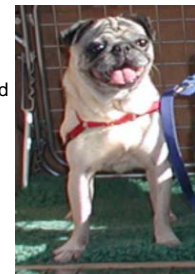
Pet Peeves, Inc. is a 501(c) 3 organization, completely driven by volunteers. Donations are tax deductible to the highest extent of the law.
